Q2) On Monday Whitney was paid £118. On Tuesday she was paid £27 more than on Monday. On Wednesday she was paid £27 less than on Monday. How much was Whitney paid in total? How many calculations did you do? Is there a more efficient method?

Q3) A millman has 250 bottles of milk. He collects another 160 from the dairy and delivers 375 during the day. How many does he have left?

Q4) My money only went to collect money. I have £64 notes. I have double the amount of money as the other. How much money do I have?

 $125 + 160 = 285$

 $410 - 375 = 35$

Q4) $1648 + 21648 = 23296$
 $23296 + 1648 = 24944$

Q1) Summarise what has happened in the chapters that you have just listened to. (3 marks)

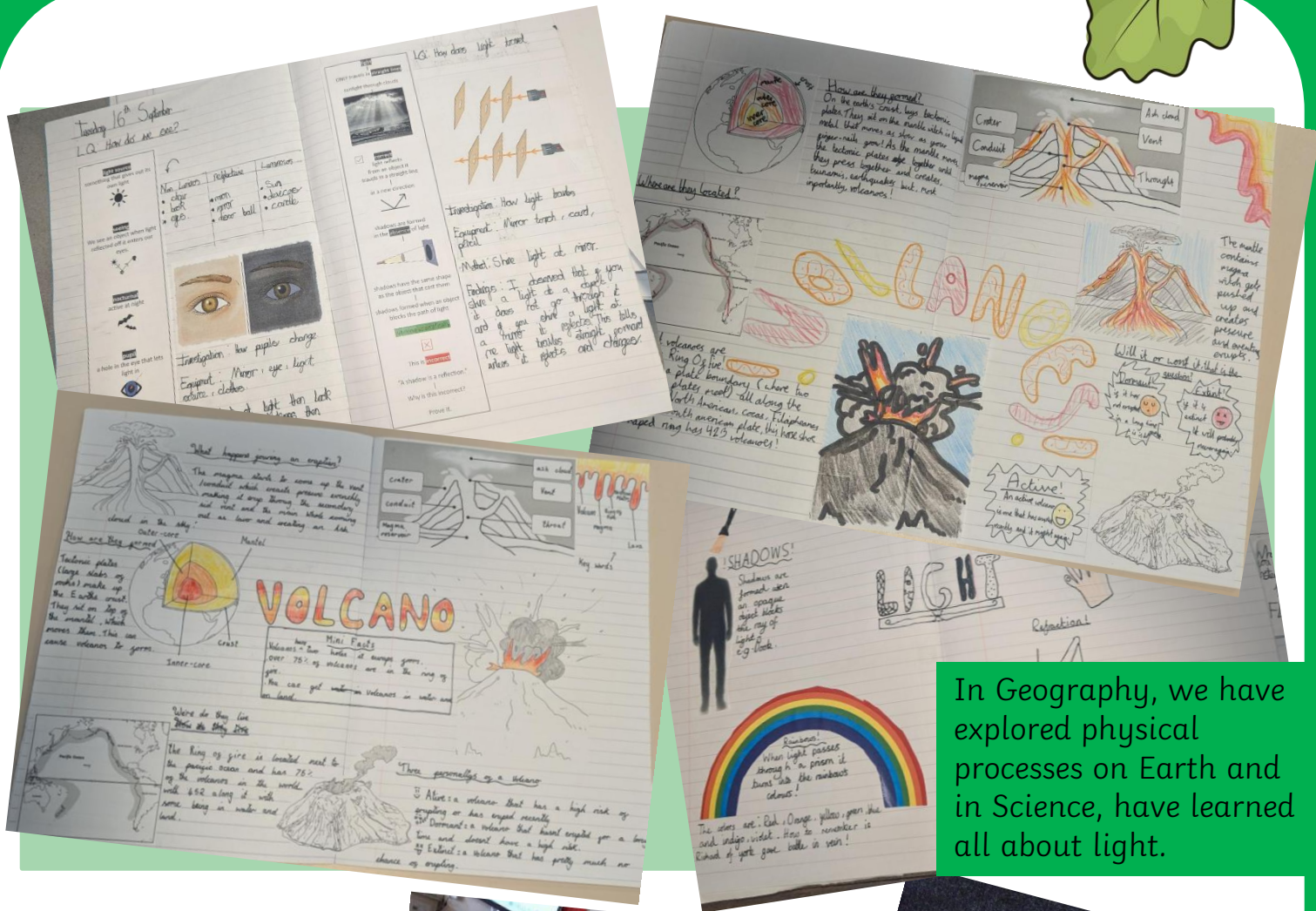
Q2) Why is Bradley so possessive over Jeff? (1 mark)
