Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2012/2013

The Pupil Premium Grant for 2012 – 2013 was used to provide support for pupils in the development of reading, writing and number skills.

Nature of support 2012/2013

Summary of spending and actions taken:

- a) Provision of teaching assistant time to free teacher time to allow teachers to challenge and support more able pupils in reading, writing and mathematics to develop higher order skills throughout the school (as appropriate for each pupil – not all pupils need intervention in all subjects)
- b) Provision of teaching assistant support to target pupils requiring help to develop phonic skills in Y1 / Y2 – planning carried out by class teacher.
- b) Bought in professional SEN expertise to ensure that pupils on SEN register eligible for FSM have an appropriately planned, delivered, monitored and evaluated Individual Education Plan which addresses their specific learning needs in order to ensure they make progress in reading
- c) Purchase of teaching assistant time to develop basic numeracy skills where appropriate.
- d) Purchase of reading materials to support and challenge pupils in the development of reading skills.

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

The progress of all pupils throughout the school is measured each term. Evidence shows that the spending of the Pupil Premium Grant had a positive impact on pupil standards and progress for most eligible pupils in the identified areas throughout the school.
